Birthday Parties

We make birthday parties fun and educational. Children can handle the docile snakes with supervision. Snakes used for birthday parties are non-venomous. A poster is available for each child who attends, to display on his or her wall, which shows the venomous snakes that live in southeast Texas. We explain identifying characteristics of these dangerous snakes and what to do if someone is bitten (age 8 and above). Ages 4 -7 receive less detail on venomous snakes and more detail on how to treat and respect snakes.
